This reporting format excludes capital project and debt service expenditures that totaled \$10.5 million. Per the direction of the staff reviewing this report, not allocated revenues were reduced by the same amount. Contributions to endowments were approximately \$1.3M. Changes in seat related gift programs and timing resulted in an increase in contributions of approximately \$2.75M. All contribution amounts related to seating in venues are reported by sport. Any related expenditures beyond the operation of the seating area are reported as unallocated. MSU had 7 home football games during 2011-12. MSU had 9 teams and individuals from 8 other teams compete in NCAA championships. The football team participated in the inaugural Big Ten Championship game and the Outback Bowl. Men's basketball also participated in the inaugural Carrier Classic in San Diego.
